

Holiday Tour 1978:

A period green and ivory-trimmed clapboard facade gives the passer-by no clue that this house serves a dual function, as business office and residence, for its present owners. Its scale, size, and large front porch suggest late Victorian design but in detail the house follows the less elaborate style favored early In this century.

Built in 1911 by B. H. Sparks, the house became the property of attorney Harry Wooding, Jr. in 1922. His father, Mayor Harry Wooding, who served the longest tenure as mayor in the history of the nation, lived here the last years of his life until his death in 1938 at the age of 94. The house remained in the Wooding family until purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Aiken in June of 1977. Since then, the owners' creativity and careful planning, evident in the working spaces and living area, have made this house a prime example of adaptive use in Danville.

Tour Book 1979:

Situated on one of the most spacious lots on Holbrook Avenue, this commodious two-story red brick dwelling commands attention even from Main Street. It was built about 1883 as the handsome residence for Matthew P. Jordan, some of whose descendants live in the area today. The notable Queen Anne style house features a contrasting gable and three-part projecting bays. A massive front porch with square brick columns, a later addition, reinforces the solid appearance of the house.

Mr. Jordan, a successful leaf tobacco dealer, lived here with his family about 20 years. After his death Mrs. Jordan retained the house until 1906, when it was sold to Mr. and Mrs. John J. Westbrook. Several years later the Holbrook Avenue residence was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. F. L. Chapman. Often remembered as the "Anderson House", it was home to the Chesley S. Anderson family for 50 years until Mrs. Anderson sold the property to Mr. and Mrs. Gerald A. Schori in 1966. Since 1971 it has been the home of realtor N. Lee Isenhour and his family. Ornamental plaster ceilings, parquet floors, and large mirrors lend this comfortable Victorian dwelling a memorable period flavor.

Tour Book 2007:

The Trakases steward this home built for Matthew Pate Jordan and Alice Witcher Jordan in 1883. An early Queen Anne, the structure retains Italianate influence in its bracketed cornice and arched window openings featuring keystones and springblocks. Ornamental plaster ceilings, parquet floors, and 19th century chandeliers distinguish the interior.

The M. P. Jordan Company founder rose to prominence in Danville's flourishing tobacco business serving as president of the Danville Tobacco Association. He later became president of both the Commercial Bank and the People's Savings and Loan, as well as a principal investor in the Dan River Power and Manufacturing Company – later merged as a part of Dan River, Inc.

Tour Book 2010:

A pioneer in the development of Holbrook Avenue above Col. William Rison's old estate, Matthew Pate Jordan completed this stylish early Queen Anne dwelling in 1883. Its bracketed cornice and arched window openings featuring keystones and springblocks evidence Italianate design as well. Here, Mr. Jordan and his wife, the former Alice Witcher, entertained friends and Mr. Jordan's business colleagues in richly appointed formal rooms with ornamental plaster ceilings and parquet floors which survive to this day. Original late-19th-century chandeliers continue to illuminate some these handsome spaces, along with opulent gilded mirrors from the period.

The M.P. Jordan Company founder rose to prominence in Danville's flourishing tobacco business, serving as an early president of the Danville Tobacco Association. Later, he became president of both the Commercial Bank and the People's Savings and Loan, as well as a principal investor in the Dan River Power and Manufacturing Company - later incorporated as part of Dan River, Inc.

A couple years after her husband's death, Mrs. Jordan sold the family home, in 1906, to John J. and Maria Westbrook, members of a family long identified with Westbrook Elevator, Danville's only maker of freight and passenger "lifts." The couple resided here for about a decade.

If the Jordans' sumptuous residence helped make Holbrook Avenue itself a fashionable address, it was one of their successors, Mr. and Mrs. Chesley S. Anderson, who lived here long enough - from 1916 to 1966 - that even today some older Danvillians refer to 130 Holbrook Avenue as the Anderson House.

Since acquiring the property in 1997, Bill and Kay Trakas have taken seriously their stewardship role in caring for the historic Jordan-Anderson House. Not only have they tended to such necessities as the previously long-neglected roof, but they also continue to refurbish the gracious rooms, enhancing their historic charm with a number of period-appropriate 19th-century furnishings. Some of these pieces reflect the owners' enthusiasm for America's Aesthetic Movement, at its zenith in the late-19th century when this house was new.

Tour Book 1988:

In 1907 and 1908 F. Lewis Douthat and Pattie Douthat built their new homes side by side on the first two lots behind the Sutherlin mansion. This was among the last property that Janie P. Sutherlin, the Major's widow of 15 years, sold from what was once the large rear yard of the antebellum house. In the two decades after the first Sutherlin land was subdivided in 1888,

Holbrook and Sutherlin avenues had witnessed rapid development, becoming—along with Main Street—among the most sought after residential sites in Danville.

Miss Pattie Douthat's house at 135 Holbrook Avenue remained in the family for more than 60 years; her last sister Miss Champ Douthat, died here in 1969. For some ten years thereafter it was the property of longtime residents of the street, Mr. and Mrs. N. Lee Isenhour, and from 1981 to 1986 it was the home of Mr. Houston Sharpe.

Newly painted gray with white trim, colors characteristic of the Colonial Revival style in turn-ofthe-century America, this dwelling is typical of Danville's sturdy Edwardian-era houses, Atypical however is its striking contemporary decor and furnishings. Rich-hued walls set off the original classical interior appointments and woodwork, all painted gleaming white by the present owner.

Tour Book 1994:

Characteristic of the imposing, mostly two-story houses lining Holbrook Avenue, this house is one of two neighboring structures owned originally by members of the Douthat family. Following the lead of Mr. F. Lewis Douthat, who built the house at 133 Holbrook Avenue in 1907, his sister Miss Pattie Douthat completed her home next door a year later. Together, these houses occupy practically the last lots developed from what had been the vast rear yard of the ante-bellum Sutherlin Mansion on Main Street.

A handsome example of Edwardian domestic architecture, Miss Pattie's house at 135 Holbrook Avenue still features a hipped roof, projecting gable, and a full-length front porch with Georgian Revival columns and low Craftsman-type balustrade. Miss Douthat's home remained in the family for more than 60 years, until the death of her last sister, Miss Champ Douthat, in 1969. For about the next dozen years, the house belonged to long-time Holbrook Avenue residents Mr. and Mrs. N. Lee Isenhour. From 1981 to 1986 it was the home of Mr. Houston Shame.

Soon after Mr. Rick Barker purchased the house in 1987, he painted the house a Colonial Revival gray with white trim and teal accents, emphasizing its simple classical detailing. Inside, serene contemporary decor coupled with expanses of jewel-toned walls make a striking counterpoint to the neo-classically-inspired staircase, mantels, and other millwork, most of which is enameled a gleaming white.

Her attentive stewardship has returned the original luster to this superb structure.

Ornamental terracotta panels enrich the facade of this two-and-a-half-story brick dwelling built in 1889 for Willis J. Dance. With its striking octagonal-ended projection capped by an ogee dome, the house bears an architectural family resemblance to the nearby W.F. Patton House at 926 Main Street. Built circa-1890, this Main Street mansion shares the Queen Anne-style form and footprint of its Holbrook Avenue cousin.

Until the mid-1980s this dwelling continued to be associated with the Donelson family, descendants of the Dance and Williamson families, who at this address helped establish Holbrook Avenue as one the city's most fashionable thoroughfares. It was developed from land once part of the rear yard of Major and Mrs. Sutherlin's antebellum mansion.

In 1999, Ms. Alfrieta Bennett acquired the Holbrook Avenue house, beginning the process of bringing this once grand mansion back from the brink—including years of neglect and the effects of a disastrous fire which destroyed much of the second floor and attic over a decade ago. Her able efforts are being enhanced in the capable hands of Mr. Dave Fieldman who, since purchasing this house in 2004, is continuing here in Danville the sort of careful restoration he lavished on his last address in Petersburg, Virginia, an 18th century house which he refurbished with an eye to integrity. Such also is the attention to original detail he is undertaking room-by-room, much of it hands-on, with his latest restoration project here in Danville.

An angular corner turret makes the silhouette of this clapboard sought-after address. For the preserving almost all its original house unmistakable on a street rich in Victorian dwellings. in addition to the turret, most of the hallmarks typical of the Queen Anne style are visible — varied projections, angles, wood shingles, and other decorations that make up its asymmetrical outline. A classical porch spans the entire front. Painted in shades of taupe, the house looks much as it must have appeared in 1889 when it was built for Mary C. Copeland. Her husband, W.S. Copeland was one of seven investors who in 1888 purchased nine lots fronting on Holbrook Avenue, land once part of Major Sutherlin's extensive property behind his mansion at 975 Main Street, On lot number 7, the Copelands had the present house built in 1889, apparently for speculation, as Holbrook Avenue was an increasingly five years they owned the house, there is no record that the Copelands ever lived here, In 1894 they sold the property to Harrison Robertson, Jr. City directories of the period indicate that he and his wife lived at this address at least as early as 1899, until they sold the house in 1912.

For the next seventy years, members of the Neal family, beginning with Mr. and Mrs. John E. Neal, owned the property and lived here. Mr. Neal and several members of succeeding generations were closely identified in Danville with the tobacco warehouse business. One of his daughters- in-law, Mrs. James T. Neal, was among the last family members to reside here. It was she who sold the property to the present owners in 1982.

Since then the Fletchers have renewed the entire structure, details, including Eastlake inspired woodwork and mantels, and intricate plaster ceiling medallions. These features are enhanced by the warm palette of rusts, golds, and tans, accented by cool blues and greens, seen throughout the house on the walls, upholstery and window treatments. A beautifully remodeled kitchen and family room at the rear of the first floor fit comfortably next to 1890s rooms. The Fletchers' inspiration has made of 145 Holbrook Avenue a bright, comfortable home, with space as well for a professional office upstairs.

Tour Book 2016:

An angular corner turret makes the silhouette of this weather boarded house unmistakable on a street rich in Victorian dwellings. In addition to the turret, most of the hallmarks typical of the

Queen Anne style are visible dash including varied projections, angles, and other decoration that make up its asymmetrical outline. A classical porch spans the entire first level. Painted in shades of taupe, the house recalls much of its early appearance, when it was built by investor and journalist / publisher W. S. Copeland for his wife Mary.

Copeland and others purchased and subdivided land on what was part of Major Sutherlin's extensive property behind his mansion at 975 Main Street. He and his wife moved into the house in 1890. Copeland owned a major interest in the *Danville Register* for a number of years and served as its editor. He sold his interest in 1894 and moved to Richmond, where he became one of the founders of the *Richmond Times Dispatch*. Over the years his financial interests included newspapers in Roanoke and Newport News. Copeland's reputation as a respected journalist and winner of coveted awards for same, reflects how Danville – a dynamic, post-Civil War town of the New South – help propel the career of this ambitious newspaperman. He and a host of other entrepreneurs drawn here, clearly made this community a steppingstone to greater fame and fortune in larger cities.

In 1894, Copeland sold the property to Harrison Robertson, Jr., who lived there with his family from about 1900 until 1912, when it was sold to the Neal family of tobacco warehouse fame. Their forebear, Thomas D. Neil, predicted the auction sale of loose-leaf tobacco in 1858 at the first Neal's Warehouse. Mr and Mrs John Neal were the first owners of the Holbrook dwelling that remained in the Neal family for over 70 years until it was sold to the present owners.

Over the years the home has undergone significant renovation. About 1920, the Neal family added a second-floor sunroom, along with the present front porch, and adapted the house as a duplex. It remained a two-family dwelling until 1982. Since then, under the watch of the present owners, only the fourth stewards of the house over the past 125 years, its single-family status has been reclaimed. The first floor was renewed, with attention to maintaining much of the original detail, including Eastlake-inspired woodwork, and a handsome original mantle and intricate ceiling medallion in the living room. The owners opened up a warren of small rooms to provide a comfortable kitchen, and refurbished the compact back yard for ease of maintenance and outdoor living in warm weather.

In 2015, an undetected leak caused major damage to the property. Pictures of the work required to repair and restore the property will be on display during the tour.

Tasteful use of materials such as dark red-brown brick, and a well-executed symmetrical design characterize the early-20th-century house of Mr. and Mrs. Fitzhugh Hiltzheimer. Its restful, linear lines, generous proportions, and Georgian Revival details are typical of the era when Americans were borrowing liberally from the 18th-century forms of their Colonial past. The same spirit prevails inside, evident in the elegant central stairway that leads to the second floor.

In 1906 Mildred Conway, wife of L.B. Conway, Jr., purchased from Annie H. Berkeley the lot on which this house was constructed shortly thereafter. The deed stipulated that no house erected on the property would be "located nearer Holbrook Avenue than the front of the house of Mrs. Berkeley," whose brick Italianate-style dwelling still stands at 150 Holbrook Avenue next door. In fact, it is the uniform setback of the several houses in this block that gives the street its gracious mien.

Mr. and Mrs. Conway moved to Laurel Cliff Farm in 1922, and sold the house to Mr. and Mrs. Strathmore Owens, who lived on Holbrook Avenue for more than a quarter century. Later it served as the parsonage for Mt. Vernon United Methodist Church until the Hiltzheimers acquired the property in 1972. Since then they have brought out the beauty of the house with a loving restoration, right down to the gleaming stair rails and the mellow hand-rubbed wood of the front door.

Tour Book 1996:

The 1906 deed restriction of Annie H. Berkeley, who sold this lot to the original builders and stipulated that no house erected on this property would be located nearer Holbrook Avenue than the front of her Italianate style dwelling next door at 150 Holbrook, set in motion a uniform setback that provides the gracious streetscape of the avenue. Mildred Conway, and her husband, L. B. Conway, Jr., constructed the 1907 symmetrical Four Square dwelling with dark red-brown brick and elegant Georgian Revival details reminiscent of America's 18th Century forms of our Colonial past. Its Prairie-Style architecture reflects the building trends that were so popular in the early part of this century.

The interior of the home focuses around the elegant central stairway leading to the second floor bedrooms. In 1922 when the Conways moved to Laurel Cliff Farm, the home was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Strathmore Owens, who lived on Holbrook Avenue for more than 25 years. Later the dwelling served as the parsonage for Mt. Vernon United Methodist Church until Mr. and Mrs. Fitzhugh Hiltzheimer bought the home in 1972. In a labor of love, they restored the home for their residence until it was sold to Bob and Mona Beecy in 1994. To get ready for the tour and share their home with our guests this holiday season, the Beecys have delved into restoration projects that otherwise would have taken a back seat to their already busy schedules which include numerous contributions to the civic life of Danville. Bob and Mona both work at Dan River, Inc.

The Beecys are well-respected in the Old West End for their glorious facade and interior restoration of the old Isenhour four-plex at 132-138 Holbrook Avenue. The rich color scheme of the frame dwelling enhances the street and draws attention to the inviting front balconies and

porches. Through the efforts and preservation inclinations of the Beecys and other property owners on Holbrook Avenue, this charming street is experiencing a renaissance of restoration and a new lease on life for the 21st century.

Since 2011, that quest has been given renewed impetus by present owners Dave Corp and Ann Sylves, among Danville's most passionate transplants and advocates for the city's architectural legacy. Very carefully, the couple has focused on recapturing the late-19th-century spirit of its public spaces, with period-appropriate chandeliers and other fittings, including restored pocket doors. They also continue to make the house ever more functional, upstairs and down, with a keen eye to architectural integrity.

Rising two-and-a-half stories above Holbrook Avenue, the gable end dominating the face of this dwelling forms a huge asymmetrical triangle, a shape reminiscent of Newport, Rhode Island, cottages whose sweeping lines were the "Contemporary" architecture of the late-l9th century. It also shares with those Shingle Style mansions such details as the shingled projection at the top of the gable, the second-story bay window, a shed-roofed porch, and a side wing. Inside and out, like the Newport cottages, this Queen-Anne-era house was modern in concept for the mid-1890s, when it was completed for Mamie Echols Overbey and her husband Dan A. Overbey. R.B. Graham, one of Danville's most productive architect-contractors of the period, probably built the house, either as a speculative venture or for the Overbeys, who purchased the property from Graham and his wife in August of 1895. The choice corner lot (no. 1) was part of the 1888 subdivision of the original Sutherlin estate, which once extended from behind Major Sutherlin's Main Street mansion back to Green Street.

Dan A. Overbey, a businessman who held prominent positions as a wholesale grocer, and later with Danville Lumber Company and First National Bank, lived here with his family until about 1912 when they moved to 605 Holbrook Avenue, a substantial brick Italianate house razed for apartments about a decade ago. After Annie D. Overbey purchased the house in 1912, she and her husband John B. Overbey, a son of D.A. Overbey, retained the property until 1920 when they sold it to James P. Harrison. Seven years later it was purchased by E.W. Arnett. Shortly thereafter on the rear portion of the lot facing Green Street, the Arnett Apartments were built. After the death of Mr. Arnett's son, Dr. E.W. Arnett, Jr., in 1968, the house remained the property of the Arnett heirs until it was sold at auction to settle their estate in 1980.

What was on the day of the sale a gray, dingy relic, or so many thought, has been transformed by the Abreus into an airy, inviting home that is beautifully cared for and much loved. Mrs. Abreu is no stranger to restoration projects; she and her parents Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Shadrick have restored several houses in the neighborhood, and the Shadricks' painstaking work is evident here as well. Together they have cleaned and renewed its original stained glass, parquet floor in the entrance hail, and several striking hardwood mantels, among many other appointments, to give the house the elegance it enjoyed in its prime. Mr. and Mrs. Abreu have also added to the house period touches that, while not original to the structure, are eminently authentic; these include the anaglypta wainscoting in the dining room, a pressed tin ceiling in the butler's pantry, and several stained-glass transoms that are copies of originals elsewhere in the house. Mr. Abreu designed a brick terrace just outside the breakfast room, and the couple recently tucked a bath, very discretely, into a former pantry. Furnishings include a number of handsome Victorian pieces as well as pieces from earlier in the 19th century. Complete with a late Victorian tri-color paint scheme outside, the entire house has been returned to an appearance much as it must have looked in the 1890s and early 1900s.

Tour Book 1991:

This stucco home was built originally as a frame dwelling in 1903, and rebuilt extensively as a Foursquare style structure following a fire in 1914. James M. Seegar, a partner in L.C. Clarke & Co., owned the home some thirty years until he lost the property early in the Depression. The home was rented until 1938 when it was purchased at auction by George P. Richmond. In 1987, Charles Lovelace bought the home and subsequently sold it to Larry and Sherry Gott in May 1991. The Gotts, who relocated to Danville from Virginia's Eastern Shore, saw the potential of the sadly neglected home.

The original owner Mr. Seegar, worked with Lawrence C. Clarke as co-owner of L.C. Clarke & Co. These merchants for hardware, sporting goods, guns, bicycles, and locks remained at 332 Main Street until the mid-1920's. Sater's then opened at this location, where it remained until closing last spring. In 1929 Mr. Seegar joined Virginia Hardware on Lynn Street. Two years later he lost

his home in a foreclosure, and rented the property from the bank until 1937, when his family moved to Watson Street. For the next three decades, the Holbrook Avenue dwelling was home to the G.P. Richmond family.

Since moving here, the Gotts have repaired extensive plaster damage from frozen, leaking plumbing, and removed avocado green carpet, which covered heart pine flooring in excellent condition. Heavy old draperies have been replaced with lace and sheers, which enhance lovely pastel walls.

Guests in the home will find original chandeliers in the foyer, parlor, and dining room; two fireplaces fitted for gas logs, and two sets of French doom. The large dining room features paneled wainscoting with a plate rail.

On display are Buckley Moss watercolors, which were engagement and wedding presents; a Persis Wallace watercolor, hobo art, and an antique collection of china dolls inherited from Mrs. Gott's great-grandmother and grandmother. The plate rail in the dining room is lined with a collection of hand painted Bavarian china and turn-of-the- century Royal Doulton. Other memorabilia include a large collection of old family photos, pattern and pressed glass, and Civil War weapons. For the tour, the Gotts will also display vintage Santas, a turn-of-the-century tree village, and the family Christmas tree decorated with inherited ornaments, and lighted with 1930's style large lights.

Tour Book 1982:

As the popularity of a Holbrook Avenue address increased in the late 19th century, the remaining undeveloped land became much sought after. By 1900 about the last such parcel, the old John G. Jefferson estate, was subdivided into four lots. Lot No. 2 became the site for the home of George A. Watson, who in 1910 purchased the land from William H. Deitrick. A prominent local contractor, Deitrick probably built the Watson's house, a sort of Prairie-Style Four Square, which was completed in 1911 at a cost of \$6,000.

With its massive porch and broad hipped roof with deep eaves and geometric brackets, the house shares many stylistic similarities with the residence built the same year for R. Addison Schoolfield at 1124 Main Street -- a house designed by the popular local architect of the day, Charles G. Pettit, who also designed the similarly styled Schoolfield Elementary School and the Elks Club.

After the untimely death of Mr. Watson, a tobacconist, in 1918, Sallie Keen Watson, his widow, continued to live in the Holbrook Avenue house for many years. In 1939 she sold it to Mr. and Mrs. Charles M. Hundley, who lived here only a year before the house was acquired by the Oliver sisters, Mary and Elizabeth, who are well remembered by several Danville generations for

their many dedicated years' as teachers in Danville's Public Schools. Also residing here during this period were the long time and much-loved minister of Mount Vernon Methodist Church, and his wife, Dr. and Mrs. John B. Winn.

In 1973, three years after the death of her sister Mary, Elizabeth Oliver sold the house to Mr. and Mrs. Lee E. Bird, III. Over the past nine years Mr. and Mrs. Bird and their three sons have worked successfully to harmonize new features and furnishings while respecting the original structure. The distinctive interior features Colonial Revival mantles, maple and pine floors, and stained glass in the oriel window above the stairway landing. The main supports of this entrance-hall staircase echo the battered (tapered) porch piers outside.

Tour Book 1999:

A porch with massive brick columns and broad hipped roof with deep eaves and geometric brackets, all reflect the solid Prairie School design of this red-brick house built in 1911. It shares many stylistic similarities with the residence built that same year for R. Addison Schoolfield at 1124 Main Street. That Main Street mansion was designed by Charles G. Pettit, the popular architect of Lynchburg and Danville who also designed the former Schoolfield School on Baltimore Avenue and the Elks Club downtown.

The block where the house at 604 Holbrook Avenue was built was among the last parcels on the popular street to be developed – part of the old John G. Jefferson estate which was subdivided in 1900. In 1910, George A. Watson purchased lot #2 of this tract from William H. Deitrick. Well-known as a prominent local contractor for many of Danville's stylish dwellings and other structures, Deitrick probably built the Watson's house, which was valued originally at \$6,000.

Mrs. Watson, the former Sallie Keen, lived in the Holbrook Avenue house for many years after the untimely death in 1918 of Mr. Watson, a well-known local tobacconist. In 1939 she sold the house to Mr. and Mrs. Charles M, Hundley, who lived here only a year before the house was acquired by Mary and Elizabeth Oliver. The Oliver sisters are recalled fondly by generations of Danvillians for their many years as dedicated teachers in Danville's public schools. During this period, the house was home also to the longtime and much-loved minister of Mount Vernon United Methodist Church, the Rev. Dr. John B. Winn, and his wife.

In 1973, three years after the death of her sister Mary, Elizabeth Oliver sold the house to its present owners, Mr. and Mrs. Lee E. Bird III. For more than 25 years, Mr. and Mrs. Bird and their family have continually lavished attention on the maintenance of their home. In the process they have enhanced its classic American Foursquare design with appropriate new features such as a charming entry gate and brick wall enclosing an English-inspired cottage garden.

The distinctive interior features Colonial Revival mantels, maple and pine floors, and stained glass in the oriel window above the stairway landing. The main supports of this prominent entrance-hall staircase echo the battered (tapered) porch piers outside. Handsome examples of furniture reproduced or adapted from antique originals grace several of the spacious rooms. These pieces were hand-crafted by one of the Bird's three sons, Lonnie, a cabinetmaker and teacher in Gallipolis, Ohio.

The very fabric of this comfortable two-story L-shaped dwelling holds a surprising clue confirming its origins. During their renovation, the present owners discovered a chalk-scrawled

message tucked away on wide pine sheathing boards. It reads, "Rosa Brown moved into this house on Oct. 31, 1909." A ten-year-old at the time, Miss brown was among the family's younger children ranging in age from three to 26 (three daughters and three sons), who moved into the new house completed for their parents, William and Emily Brown in 1909. By this time too, Mr. Brown, a native of Albemarle County, had just served a term as a Danville Delegate to the Virginia General Assembly, succeeding the late Del. John Taylor by way of a special election. In addition to his legislative service, Mr. Brown's varied Danville career had included grocer and – for eight years before and after the First World War – postmaster.

After the family left Danville for Florida in 1922, and in the decades since, at least three other well-known families called this comfortable dwelling home until 2013, Since Steve and Susan Wilson acquired the property, they have systematically refurbished its systems, addressed structural issues, and improved its appeal cosmetically. Its pleasing asymmetrical form echoes slight earlier Queen Anne houses, but with simpler details like its expansive L-shaped porch with Colonial Revival columns and balusters.

When the Wilsons relocated to Danville over a dozen years ago, they quickly purchased an historic Main Street mansion for their home. Since then, the Holbrook Avenue project open for the DHA tour is only the latest of several other historic rehabs they have undertaken, all with considerable success and contributing materially to the preservation and well-being of the Old West End neighborhood.
