By 1910, with Danville's population approaching 25,000, the city's population "stew" had become a bit richer than its original Southern stock. Danville's late-18th-century founders were farmers of British as Scots- Irish descent. They were joined in the tobacco string-town along the Dan by many African Americans, slave and free, plus a few German settlers – all steeped in Protestant tradition. Just before the civil war, German Jewish families began trickling in,

followed by Irish Catholics, Jews from Eastern Europe, and by 1907, the community's first Greek immigrants.

For the most part, Greek men were the principal “scouts” from the old country who arrived here first and got settled before the women joined them, especially in a host of family-operated eateries and restaurants that dotted downtown, the city's old tobacco district and the mill village Schoolfield. The Busy Bee and Schoolfield Lunch, that survive for much of the 20th century and a bit into the 21st, we're just two of many that became local legends in a city where Greek citizens once monopolized the restaurant business.

Danville's Greek community – that hailed from all over Greece, reflecting the desperate backgrounds, dialects, and customs of their ancient land – coalesced around national origin, a strong ethnic and cultural identity and especially their Greek Orthodox faith. The first official organization, “Socrates,” was a rallying point for an early Greek school, with instruction in religion, the language and history of Greece and its culture, that met after public school twice a week in the basement of the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany. Emerging as well from this common bond (Socrates), during the depths of the Second World War, was the resolve to build a permanent church for Greek Orthodox worshippers.

In 1943, trustees for the congregation then being organized acquired a church site directly across from their school in the Episcopal Church. Partitioned from property situated adjacent to the old Bruce James house at 803 Main St, the lot was conveyed by his widow, Annie Schoolfield James. Members chose architect Robert W. Thompson for the compact, handsome design built under the watch of contractor P. L. Anderson. Mellow sandstone faces the walls and gable ends and slate covers the roof of the edifice, cornered by a low entrance tower capped by a crenelated parapet. In 1947, the congregation held its first services in the new Gothic-inspired church, complete with richly ornamented icons, stained glass, and furnishings, all paid for, like the building itself, by devoted members. The church was called St. Peter's, after the Apostle – also namesake and patron saint for the charter member Peter G. Maurakis who received the key to the new church. Currently the church is proud to have its first ever female president, Stella Sakellaris Newill.

Today, 70 years on, the serene presence of the church, nestled quietly among many earlier building styles and forms along Jefferson Avenue, remains an architectural grace note and testament to the rich spiritual legacy of generations of Danvillians of Greek descent.

The recent, visible renaissance on Jefferson Avenue continues unabated, driven by the influx of folks who have adopted Danville as their home and their restoration avocation. Prime examples are Rod Tomlinson and Maria Mejias who moved last year from Long Island, New York to purchase and refurbish Danville's historic H. Lee Boatwright House at 904 Main Street.

In addition to attention the couple is lavishing on their columned Main Street mansion, they have made the reclamation of this property at 131 Jefferson Avenue, as well as its neighbor at 125 Jefferson, a priority. When complete, this work-in-progress—two stories of solid brick over a raised basement—will include a trio of handsome apartments, one of which already is occupied by Mr. Tomlinson's son, Rodney, himself an integral part of the ongoing rehab.

The house of simple Italianate design was built for Mrs. James B. Harrington, apparently in 1879, on a 150-foot lot at Jefferson's corner with Patton, adjoining land where that same year the present Episcopal Church was being constructed. Going up at that time diagonally across the

street, was another masonry building, the Presbyterian Church (later First Christian) at 200 Jefferson, also featured on the 2004 Tour.

Isabella Harrington died in 1894, and her husband, and other members of the family continued to reside here through most of the 1890s. Legal records early in the period reflect their real estate holdings not only on Jefferson Avenue, but also in Mr. Harrington's bakery and confectioner's shop in the heart of downtown. The sale of that business and the parcel where the house at 125 Jefferson was built in the mid-1880s may have been forced by financial reverses.

About the turn of the 20th century, the Harringtons house was conveyed to the family of A.W. Douthat, a principal in the Douthat Riddle Coal Company, whose fuel supplied many local households early in the 20th century. The Douthats, who had come to Danville from Charles City County in the early 1890s, lived in the Jefferson Avenue house for about a decade before moving to Holbrook Avenue. Among their children were several daughters who distinguished themselves as educators, remembered well by an older generation of Danvillians.

Local folks today, however, most closely associate the house— which sheltered apartment dwellers for many decades—with Dr. Kenneth Weakley. A well-regarded podiatrist, Dr. Weakley purchased the structure for his office just after the World War II, establishing here a practice which he maintained for nearly 40 years.

Last summer, Homeretta Ayala, a church musician in Baltimore, Maryland, learned that the congregation of Danville's First Christian Church, a fixture on Jefferson Avenue for more than 90 years, was disbanding and was offering for sale their striking High Victorian Gothic style church. The image that first caught the eye of this organist for Baltimore's venerable Mt. Vernon Place Church was not the picture of First Christian's 125-year-old brick-and-stucco edifice, but of its century-old pipe organ. After inspecting the facility, "Homer," as she likes to be called, and her husband Joseph—who also is a church musician—were hooked ... on the organ. So, this past September they bought the organ and, of course, the building that came with it.

In the past three months, Homer and Joe Ayala worked quickly to adapt the church as an innovative concert hall, Sacred Spaces, in addition to creating a handsome apartment, which they already have rented in the rear. The building now has a new roof and an updated infrastructure of wiring, heat, and air conditioning. Ironically too, the origins of the building as a Presbyterian church some 125 years ago now have come full circle, as the Ayalas presently are leasing the building for Sunday worship to the newly- formed Christ Presbyterian Church.

As Sacred Spaces, the church edifice already has experienced a "revival" of sorts, which the Ayalas plan to continue as the 1899-1900 Moller organ—the oldest in its original site in Danville (and among the oldest Mollers anywhere)— is restored. It promises to resound with other instruments and professional musicians in a series of periodic evening concerts, which were inaugurated the Friday after Thanksgiving just past.

In less than a year, the four large apartments in this rambling Italianate dwelling have been completely renovated by new owners Mr. and Mrs. Marvin L. Moss. The mellow old floors of its spacious rooms now gleam, and cream, tan, and brown paint outside make the house a standout on the street whose houses are among the finest in the city architecturally. This house, just refurbished, now stands as a notable example of the renaissance Jefferson Avenue is enjoying after years of neglect.

From 1833 when Danville was incorporated as a town, until 1854 when the town limits were extended to Holbrook Street, Jefferson Avenue formed the southern edge of the community. Before the War Between the States its large lots were held by the Episcopal Church at the corner of Main Street, the Presbyterian Church (now First Christian) at 200 Jefferson, and the families of Green, Ross and Patton. After the War Between the States, these large parcels were subdivided and in 1887 R.A. Bendall purchased a 6 1/2-foot lot between the Green and Patton estates. Two years later he, or others in the Bendall family, improved the lot with the present richly-ornamented Italianate-style clapboard dwelling. Judging from the 1894-95 city directory the first of the family known to have lived here was Oliver P. Bendall and his wife. Four years later his brother Richard A. Bendall, who owned the property, is listed with his wife as residing here. Another brother Isaac S. Bendall lived with his family at 927 Green Street. All were prosperous tobacconists. In 1904 Oliver and Rosa Bendall moved two houses down the block to the old Ross-Patton home place, a late-Federal-style double house at 225-27 Jefferson. Richard Bendall sold the property in 1906 to Mr. and Mrs. Nicholas L. Pollok, whose family members continued to live here some thirty-five years. Mr. Pollok, a grocer, died in the late 1920s, and after the death of his wife Mr. and Mrs. Clarence A. Coley purchased the house for their residence in 1942. Since 1949 when J.D. Ley and Clarence Johnson bought the house it has been rented as apartments.

Since being acquired by Mr. and Mrs. Moss early this year, these apartments have been brought from their tired and marginal condition to become light and airy space that is functional but with period charm. Massive Eastlake-style double front doors, which have been refinished, open into a central hall typical of Victorian-era homes, and flanked by rooms freshly painted and papered in a warm palette of ivory, beige and tan. The outline of tall windows reflects in the newly- refinished floors that grace these rooms, and the original dining areas contain built-in antique china cabinets. Each apartment now has a functional attractive kitchen that leads onto a spacious rear porch, and the baths like the rest of the house have been renovated without destroying their character; they retain their original hexagonal tile, and porcelain fixtures. In addition to careful work on the walls and floors to make the house aesthetically pleasing, the owners have also taken care to renew the heating, wiring and other essential systems that make this a functional historic dwelling.

Complex geometry and the patterns created by contrasting-colored brick, make this one of the most visually lively houses on the street, and an important contributor to the row of four similar brick houses, all dating from the last half of the 1880s. The house at 230 Jefferson Avenue was built in 1886 for J. Allen Patton, a partner in the venerable local banking firm of W.S. Patton Sons & Company. At the time of his death only a few years later, he was a partner in Patton & Talbott, selling fire, life and accident insurance, and real estate. His widow continued to live here for about the next fifteen years.

Prior to its acquisition by the present owners in 1990, the house changed hands infrequently over the 70 years after the Patton heirs conveyed the property to Morris Halperin in 1919. Families such as the Dickersons, Crews, and Kecks, for example, resided here for many years or even decades. Mr. & Mrs. Coleman Maddox, Sr., who live here today beside their son, Mr. C.B. Maddox, Jr., and other energetic urban pioneers like Mr. William Wellbank who also lives next door, have made the reclamation of Jefferson Avenue a continuing project, house by house, for well over a decade.

One in a series of four brick “townhouses,” this stylish urban dwelling exhibits many details typical of eclectic 1880s Queen Anne domestic architecture — encaustic tile, stained glass, and intricate ceiling medallions, as well as complex massing and terra-cotta ornament on the facade. Of four similar brick houses, the one at 234 Jefferson was probably the first constructed of the group. Its fifty-foot lot, number 21, was among the first developed from the acreage once owned by W. S. Patton. The handsome two-story brick house, built in 1885 for Albert and Sabina Gerst, was first assessed at \$4,800. Affiliated with the leaf tobacco manufacturing firm of Stultz, Lisberger and Co., on Lynn and Franklin streets, Mr. Gerst was a son of Joseph and Amelia Gerst. The Gersts, who came to Danville in the 1850s, were among the first persons of German Jewish descent to settle here.

In 1899 Mr. and Mrs. Gerst sold their house to Gabriel and Ella Frank. For the next thirty years, Mr. and Mrs. Frank lived here with their sons and daughter on Jefferson Avenue, which during the early years of this century was a fashionable address for many Jewish families owing to the proximity of two houses of worship — Aetz Chayim Synagogue, which was recently demolished on Wilson Street, and Temple Beth Sholem on Sutherlin Avenue. After the death of Mr. Frank, who was for many years a jeweler and optician on Main Street, his house was sold in 1930 to settle his estate. New owners Mr. and Mrs. Richard Whitler lived here for the next sixteen years. Even after its sale to several absentee owners, the property remained a single-family dwelling until the 1970s.

Earlier this year the present owners purchased the house from George Shields, Jr. In several months' time Mr. Bragg and Mr. Williams have made great strides toward returning the structure to its Victorian elegance — removing temporary partitions installed when the house was converted to a number of apartments, repairing and painting the principal rooms downstairs, and completing most of the restoration on the handsome conservatory to the left of the parlor. Mr. Bragg, who is working toward a bachelor's degree in architecture — with a concentration in historic preservation — at Virginia Tech; and Mr. Williams, who has considerable expertise in dealing with old buildings; are both well-prepared for the task of completing the restoration this singular house deserves. In nearly every room interesting architectural details in wood, mouldings and plaster abound — all drawn from the Victorian Renaissance, Eastlake, and Neo-Greco styles, among other sources. Especially dramatic is the massive corner fireplace and mantel with beveled mirror, all original, in the parlor, and an English chandelier, added by the owners, but gracing the entrance hall as if it had been there when the house was brand new a hundred years ago.

Tour Book 2000:

One in a row of similar “townhouses” dating from the 1880s, the richly ornamental dwelling at 234 Jefferson Avenue exhibits details typical of Queen Anne style—complex massing enriched by architectural terra-cotta and enlivened by stained- and leaded-glass windows. Whether one looks down at the encaustic tiled porch, or up to intricate ceiling medallions inside, the structure is an eclectic mix of color and pattern.

It was constructed in 1885 for Albert and Sabina Gerst, among the first persons of German Jewish descent to settle in Danville. Early in the 20th century, Jefferson Avenue remained an

address of choice for many Jewish families owing to the proximity of Aetz Chayim Synagogue on Wilson Street, and Temple Beth Sholem on Sutherlin Avenue.

The house at 234 Jefferson Avenue continued as a single-family dwelling until the 1970s. In 1986, energetic urban pioneers Mr. Robert Bragg and Mr. Greg Williams began restoration to reclaim the property as a house after several years' use as multiple apartments. Their work has continued in the hands of the present owners, C. B. Maddox and William J. Wellbank, who have succeeded in reclaiming original features, set off with furnishings appropriate to the structure's late-19th-century origins.

Tour Book 2005:

As the renaissance of Jefferson Avenue continues apace, two residents of the street have led the charge to invest in their own backyard. Mr. Bill Wellbank and Mr. C.B. Maddox, Jr., have to their credit nearly a dozen rehabilitation projects either completed or underway. A pair of narrow, but spacious, weather-boarded houses at 245 and 249 Jefferson—echoing their neighbors in a picturesque "row" of similar structures—are but two of those projects.

These charming wood houses, and their neighbors in the "row," all date from the early to mid-1890s. They were built on a portion of the homestead of Mr. W. S. Patton, namesake for the street which intersects Jefferson just up the block.

The two-story dwellings at 245 and 249 Jefferson, each with side-hall plan and a Queen Anne style porch were built presumably as income property for Drs. Sumter and Franklin George. Sumter George, who built 245 Jefferson in 1893, was onetime City physician (public health officer). His brother Franklin George was responsible for 249 Jefferson, built in 1894. Both men were among the local physicians most esteemed by generations of Danvillians long past.

At least one family of long standing was associated with each address. For a quarter century, 245 Jefferson was home to Mr. Robert K. Moss, who came to Danville in 1881 from Clarksville. Mr. Moss, his wife and daughters lived here from 1906 to 1930, before moving to Green Street and then Sutherlin Avenue—where the last member of the family, Miss Laura Moss, died in 1973. The house next door at 249 Jefferson sheltered the Anthony family for six decades—as renters between the World Wars, and then as owners.

Mr. John Edge currently maintains a spacious apartment, with many period features intact, at 245 Jefferson; the house at 249 promises to tantalize visitors with hints of what's to come.

As the renaissance of Jefferson Avenue continues apace, two residents of the street have led the charge to invest in their own backyard. Mr. Bill Wellbank and Mr. C.B. Maddox, Jr., have to their credit nearly a dozen rehabilitation projects either completed or underway. A pair of narrow, but spacious, weather-boarded houses at 245 and 249 Jefferson—echoing their neighbors in a picturesque "row" of similar structures—are but two of those projects.

These charming wood houses, and their neighbors in the "row," all date from the early to mid-1890s. They were built on a portion of the homestead of Mr. W. S. Patton, namesake for the street which intersects Jefferson just up the block.

The two-story dwellings at 245 and 249 Jefferson, each with side-hall plan and a Queen Anne style porch were built presumably as income property for Drs. Sumter and Franklin George. Sumter George, who built 245 Jefferson in 1893, was onetime City physician (public health officer). His brother Franklin George was responsible for 249 Jefferson, built in 1894. Both men were among the local physicians most esteemed by generations of Danvillians long past.

At least one family of long standing was associated with each address. For a quarter century, 245 Jefferson was home to Mr. Robert K. Moss, who came to Danville in 1881 from Clarksville. Mr. Moss, his wife and daughters lived here from 1906 to 1930, before moving to Green Street and then Sutherlin Avenue—where the last member of the family, Miss Laura Moss, died in 1973. The house next door at 249 Jefferson sheltered the Anthony family for six decades—as renters between the World Wars, and then as owners.

Mr. John Edge currently maintains a spacious apartment, with many period features intact, at 245 Jefferson; the house at 249 promises to tantalize visitors with hints of what's to come.

Tour Book 2017:

This narrow but spacious weatherboarded house dates from the early to mid-1890s. It was built on a portion of the homestead of Mr W. S. Patton, namesake for the street which intersects Jefferson just up the block. The two-story dwelling with a side-hall plan and a Queen Anne style porch was built presumably as income property for Dr. Franklin George in 1894. The house sheltered several generations of the Anthony family for six decades – as renters between the World Wars, and then as owners. During the First World War the family patriarch, Ernest N. Anthony, arrived in Danville where he became a valued employee of the city's utilities department, from which he retired in 1948. One of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony's three daughters, Clara, a Danville elementary school teacher for decades, was among the last family members to reside here.

At this house during the tour, a mini exhibit on Danville's streetcar history, organized by the Danville Historical Society, will chronicle the public transit's legacy in the community. Beginning with the first horse drawn cars in 1886, the exhibit follows the system's expansion in the 1890s and early 1900s with electric car routes throughout much of the old city, north, south, and west, during the heyday of the Danville Traction & Power Company, until motorized rubber-tired buses supplanted cars with steel-wheels-on-tracks in April 1938.

Tour Book 2007:

Following a complete transformation by the present owner, this once-forlorn, burned-and-boarded relic now shines as a proud contributor to a handsome row of several Queen Anne wood houses. It was one of five narrow houses in a row, all completed by the mid-1890s for Dr. Franklin George. The surviving late-19th century dwellings "march," as it were, down Jefferson Avenue, all created from the partition of a wide lot once attached to the early brick double house just up the street. That antebellum dwelling at 225-7 Jefferson, still numbered among the city's oldest, was built for Robert Ross whose niece Catherine, and her husband William S. Patton, acquired it in the late 1840s. Some 40 years later, the Patton estate conveyed to Dr. Franklin George the lot where he contracted for his new income-producing properties, including

253 Jefferson Avenue. In 1898 his brother Dr. Sumter George inherited the house, which his descendants retained as a rental for half a century.

The earliest known occupants of the dwelling included the family of A. E. Summerfield, who operated at the time one of the city's leading shoe and boot stores. By the First World War, and well into the 1920s, it was home to a Danville tobacconist, Ben V. Harvey, and his family.

In just over a year the present owner, no stranger to old house reclamation on Green Street, rescued the Jefferson Avenue house from many years of decay and dereliction.

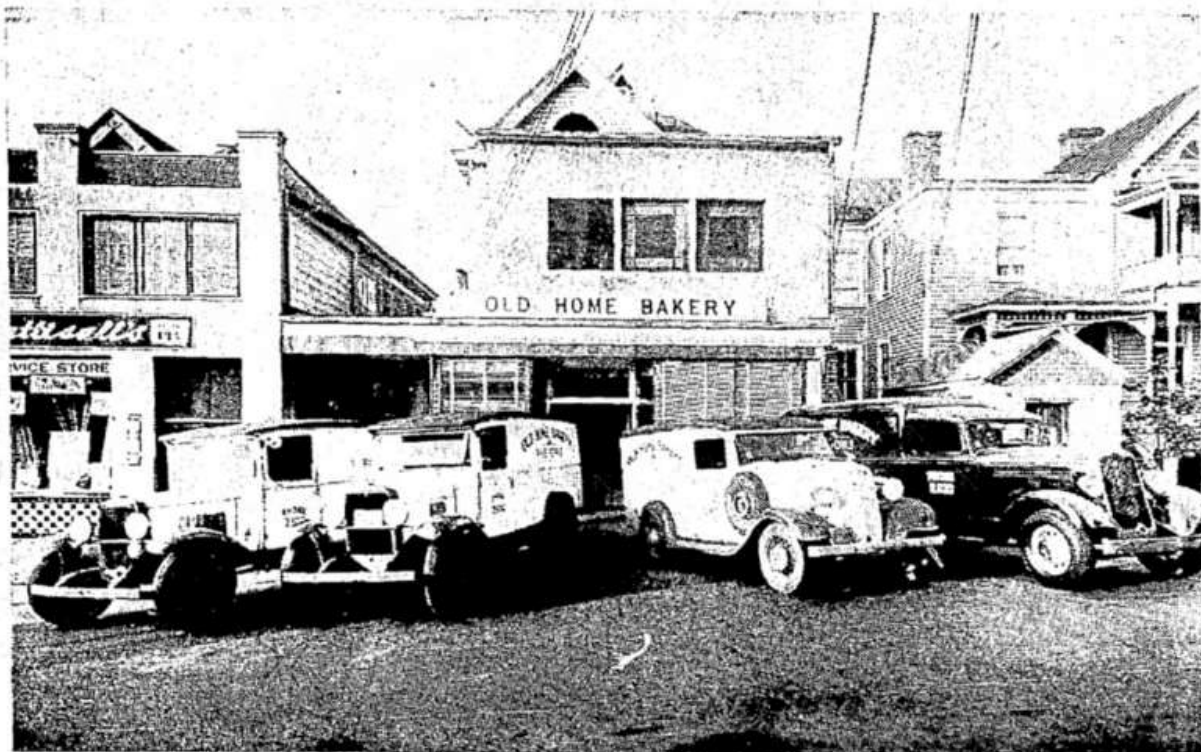

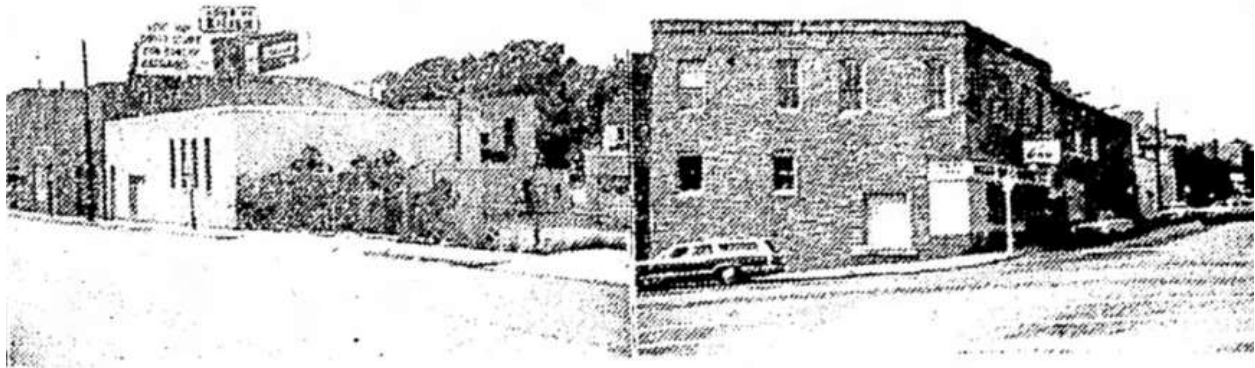

Dispatch 20 May 1891: A TERRIBLE CATASTROPHE: A pall has been cast over this entire community by a shocking accident which occurred here this morning, by which a most estimable lady lost her life. Mr. John L. Hagan, a popular young druggist, and his wife left home about 7 o'clock this morning to take a drive in a dog cart. They drove down south Main street, and crossed the bridge which passes over the railroad just beyond the corporate limits at this point. Mr. Hagan's hat flew off, and, in attempting to catch it, he frightened the horse. The animal made a spring and Mr. Hagan fell out of the cart. Mrs. Hagan then screamed, and the horse dashed off in a run. A number of colored men ran out and tried to stop the horse, but failed, and in less time than it takes to tell it the cart was upset, and the lady was thrown to the ground.

UNCONSCIOUS CONDITION: She fell on her head and was cut and bruised in the most cruel manner. She was picked up in an unconscious condition and tender hands conveyed her to her residence on Jefferson street. On examination it was found that the skull had been crushed, and all hope of her recovery was of course abandoned. She grew gradually weaker until 2:30 o'clock this afternoon, when she died. Deceased was Miss Mary C. Gray of Overton, R.I., and came here as a bride last December. She and her husband both occupied a high position in this city, and the terrible accident by which she lost her life is a great shock to the entire community.

Times 20 May 1891: MRS. HAGAN DASHED TO DEATH: May 19 Special – The most distressing and painful accident ever known in Danville occurred here at an early hour this morning. Mr. John L. Hagan, a young druggist, started out at 7 o'clock to take an early morning pleasure drive with his wife. They were driving in a dog-cart, and when on the Yanceyville road, just beyond the dry bridge, Hagan's hat blew off. In catching for his hat he frightened the horse, which jumped, and in the lurch Hagan was thrown from the cart, sustaining painful bruises. Mrs. Hagan screamed, which further frightened the animal, and a runaway followed.

Several colored people ran out from their homes on the roadway and threw up their hand in an attempt to stop the horse. The animal shied, ran upon the walkway, and upsetting the cart, threw Mrs. Hagan out. She fell on her head, crushing her skull and receiving other bruises. The lady was taken up in an insensible condition and conveyed to her home on Jefferson street, where she lingered until 2:30 P.M., when she died.

Mrs. Hagan was Mrs. Mary C. Gary, of Overton, R.I., and was married to John L. Hagan, of this city, in December last. She was a Christian woman, true to all the duties of church member, daughter, and wife, and her tragic and untimely death has caused general sadness among her long list of personal friends.

Bee 19 Nov 1924: Hagan's Drug Store Passes Into Hands of Hagan Eastland. Announcement has been made of the passing into new management of one of Danville's oldest pharmacies, and the retirement of J. L. Hagan, its owner, a figure for many years associated with the Danville drug business. Hagan's drug store, at Five Forks, has been taken over by Mr. Hagan's nephew, Hagan Eastland, of Augusta,

Kansas, who is now actively in charge of the establishment. The old name has given way to Central Pharmacy, by which it will be known henceforth. Mr. Hagan left Danville about a week ago for his old home at Christiansburg, and he is leaving that town today for a two months' tour of Kansas and Texas. Mr. Hagan's health has not been good of recent years and, it was explained today, this was the chief factor in his relinquishing ownership of the well-known corner drug store.

Dr. Hagan came to Danville from Christiansburg when he was a young man and became associated with the late P. R. Jones who operated a drug store on Main street. This was at least forty years ago. It was about the year 1890 when he acquired the drug store at Five Forks over which he had presided since earning a reputation for business integrity and that degree of reliability which is indispensable for a successful druggist. Few men were more painstaking in the conversion of what to the layman is a cryptic formula – the doctor's prescription – to the finished product.
